HISTORY IN BRIEF

The fascination with the land and the care for the coffee plantation are still present in the Paiva family even after 5 generations of coffee growers. Since the XIX century, patriarch João Ferreira cultivated coffee in the Santo Antônio do Amparo municipality, and all his dedication was an inspiration for the following generations, leading the civil engineer, Homero Aguiar Paiva, to continue the family history.

Homero acquired part of the historic and centenary Fazenda Cachoeira from his uncle Fernando Paiva, and with the support of his brother and agronomist Renato Paiva, he started planting coffee on Fazenda Guariroba, named in honor of his maternal grandparents' lands.

Since then, the constant search for excellence and the preservation of the purest traditions have been the watchwords of the farm. Homero has the support of his sister Elisa Paiva and brother-in-law Gabriel Lamounier in managing the property. Together, they seek to reinvent themselves every day by investing in innovations, while keeping the family tradition alive.
